

THE STORM .- It is many years since we have had so much damage and loss of life in Halifax Harbour by a single storm as on the night of Wednesday last. The wind blew a hurricane with occasional hail, snow, and rain from the South-east.

The Schooner Rival, from Port Hood, struck on Thrump Cap, on the eastern side of McNab's Island, and was totally wrecked. John Meagher, master; James O'Neil, and Donald McDonald, were all drowned. Patrick Delanty a passenger and John M. Donald a seaman succeeded in reaching the shore, but suffered greatly.
