Miss Dix the philanthropist passed through Halifax last week, on her way to P. E. Island and Newfoundland.

The wheat in King's County, is said to be very fine, quite ripe and free from weevil.

The Eastern Chronicle says that arrangements are being made for placing a steamer on the route between Pictou and Arichat, touching at some port in the Strait of Canso.

Mr. N. F. Gisborne has made contracts with the French Government to lay a Telegraph cable 480 miles in length, from Toulon to Algiers, and another 150 miles, trom Toulon to Corsica.—Boston paper.

On Monday 11th inst, a few men and boys at Broad Cove, C. B., succeeded in driving a school of between fifty and sixty black fish ashore at that place. The fish were very large, varying from 15 to 35 feet in length. We are informed that S. Lawrence, Esq., of Margaree, purchased the lot for about £250. On the day after the capture of the fish, Tuesday, the 12th, while the fortunate fishermen were at work, removing the blubber to Mr. Law-rence's store at Margaree harbor, they were attacked and brutally beaten by a party of men, principally, we believe, of a family named McFarlane, residing a short distance up the river. The assailants were armed with pistols, dirks, slung-shots and clubs ; the others were quite unarmed, and from the suddenness and unexpected nature of the attack, were unable to make any defence. Assistance was, however, speedly at hand, and the assailants driv-en back, but not until three men, named McLeod, McKinnon and McRae, were beaten and mangled in a most shocking manner Surgical aid was obtained as soon as possible, but doubts are entertained of the ultimate recovery of one or two of the sufferers. It is believed that an old feud existed between the assailants and the other party; but no immediate cause for this violent outrage is known, unless it be a feeling of envy on the part of the McFarlanes at the good fortune of their neigh-bors. We have not heard that any of the guilty parties have been arrested.—*Eastern Chronicle* Lamb, "


