

THE GREAT DAY OF ATONEMENT: or, *Meditations and Prayers on the last twenty-four hours of the sufferings and death of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.* pp. 200. Edited by Mrs. Colin McKenzie, Author of "Delhi, or six years in India." Gould & Lincoln, Boston.
