Prince Edward Island.

The Legislative Council of Prince Edward Island have had the evils of intemperance brought to their notice, and appear to have taken a step in the right direction.

Whereas the habit and practice of drunkenness is a moral evil highly injurious and obstructive to the happiness and prosperity of the people; and whereas this destructive vice is stated, by the highest judicial in the Island, to be lamentably increasing amongst us; and whereas it is right and expedient to prevent the prevalence and spread of the evil by all means within the power of discreet legislation; and whereas the facility with which liquors to keep public houses and sell intoxicating liquor are obtained by improper parties, and in situations where they are not required for the accommodation of the travelling public:

Therefore Resolved, That it is the opinion of this House that the whole system of licensing ought to undergo the careful revision of the Legislature, with the view of adopting a better system, in order that a remedy may be found for the evils which are acknowledged to exist.

The Hon. Joseph Howe has been requested to become Arbitrator on behalf of the Tenantry of P. E. Island, and has signified his willingness to act in that capacity.

The inability of the Government of the Island to command a majority in the Legislative Council, has induced the Executive to nominate five new members to that body, viz. Messrs. Alexander Anderson and John R. Gardiner, of Bedeque; Mr. Donald Ramsay, Beech Point; Mr. James McLaren, New Perth, and Mr. John Goff, of Three Rivers—three from Prince County, and two from King's County.
