STEAM COMMUNICATION.

WINDSOR, N. S., TO ST. JOHN, N. B.

The Steamer Emperor runs between Windsor, N. S., and St. John, N. B., every Wednesday and Saturday. The hour of starting is regulated by the time of high water at Windsor. Fare, \$3; from Halifax \$4.

The Emperor also passes from St. John to Digby and back, on Mondays and Thursdays.

The R. M. Steamship Lady Head plies between Quebec, C. E., and Pictou, N. S., calling at intermediate ports, leaving Pictou on Friday, May 9th, and every alternate Friday, and leaving Quebec on Wednesday, May 14th, and every alternate Wednesday.

LICENSED CAB DRIVERS may charge for half a mile, 6d.; one mile, 1s.; a mile and a half, 1s. 3d.; 2 miles, 1s. 6d.; 3 miles, 2s.

TRUCKMEN may charge for a load of say 10 cwt., 1/4 mile, 7d.; 1/2 mile, 9d.; one mile, 1s. 3d., &c
