STEAM COMMUNICATION.

WINDSOR, N. S., TO ST. JOHN, N. B.

The Steamer New York runs between Windsor, N. S., and St. John, N. B., every Wednesday and Saturday. The hour of starting is regulated by the time of high water at Windsor. Fare, \$4.

The New York also passes from St. John to Digby and back, on Mondays and Thursdays.

The R. M. Steamship Lady Head plies between Quebec, C. E., and Pictou, N. S., calling at intermediate ports, leaving Pictou on Friday, May 9th, at every alternate Friday, and leaving Quebec on Wednesday, May 14th, and every alternate Wednesday.

DARTMOUTH AND HALIFAX STEAMBOAT.

LEAVE DARTMOUTH at 20 min. to 6 a. m., at 6 a. m. and every 4 hour afterwards alternately to the North and South wharves, till sunset, then only to South wharf.

LEAVE HALIFAX—North Ferry, at 6 a. m., at every half hour after, till 7 p. m. South Ferry, at 15 a. m., and every half hour after to 8.45 p. m. then at 9.20, at 10, and at 11 p. m.

The Steamer Neptune is advertised to run between HALIFAX, TANGIER and SHEBROOKE Gold Diggings, leaving the city every Thursday and Saturday morning.
