

I hope that the new year will be more favourable to Kings and to peoples. To the Senate the Emperor said: "It is always with pleasure that I receive from the Senate the assurances of devotion of which you are the mouthpiece, and I count upon it to assist me in perfecting the Constitution, at the same time maintaining intact the fundamental bases upon which it rests."

ITALY.

Turin, Jan. 7.—A reactionary movement has taken place at Castellamare, in Sicily. Troops have been despatched from Palermo to the scene of the disturbances. The population of Palermo is very excited, and has offered to co-operate with the Government in the suppression of the movement.

PORTUGAL.

The latest news from Portugal, which comes down to the 3rd inst., makes no mention of any renewal of the disturbances which had some days previously given rise to much uneasiness and alarm in the capital.

RUSSIA.

The University of St. Petersburg has been closed in consequence of the recent disturbances, until a new set of regulations shall have been drawn up.

CHINA.

From Peking, a telegram via St. Petersburg brings intelligence to the 13th of November. At that date the Emperor had taken up his residence in the capital, and Prince Kung was appointed Regent of the empire.

ROME.

EARTHQUAKE IN GREECE.—Trieste, Jan. 7.—Advices received here from Athens to the 28th ult. state that a violent shock of earthquake had occurred along the northern coast of the Peloponnesus. Athens was uninjured, but New and Old Corinth, Aigion, and Patras had been damaged.

SPAIN.

THE PRIVATEER SUMPTER AT MADRID.—Jan. 6, evening.—The Government decided upon admitting the Sumter into the port of Cadiz on condition that she would place the prisoners under the protection of Spain.

THE INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION, 1862.—We are authorised by her Majesty's Commissioners to contradict a statement which has been made that it is the intention of her Most Gracious Majesty to open the Exhibition in person.

But it is said that the Prince of Wales will, by the unanimous voice of the nation, be called to perform this ceremony in the place of his royal father. A letter from the Prince of Wales to the Commissioners of the Royal Horticultural Society, is given in the English papers, expressing the Queen's desire that the statue for the new Horticultural Gardens, formerly intended to be of herself, shall be that of the great, good Prince, his dearly beloved father.

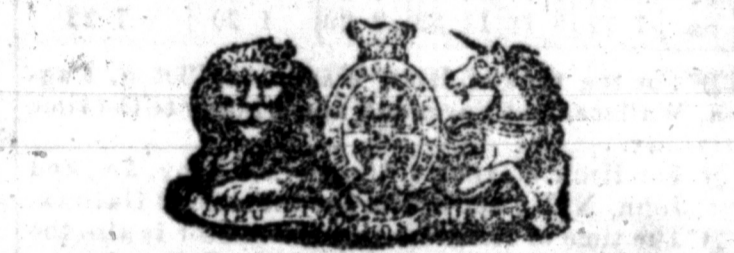
