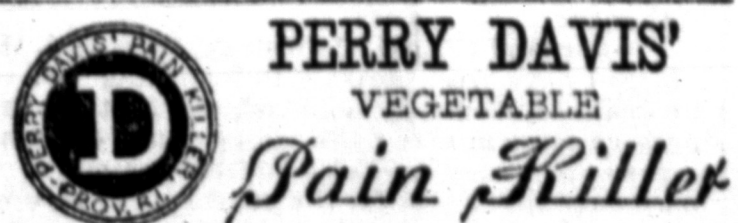
The Omnibuses start from the city half an hour earlier than the above "Halifax" and should arrive in the City about half an hour after the time named "Halifax arrive."
