ADDRESSES TO ADMIRAL MILNE on his departure, were presented on Monday last by His Worship the Mayor and the Aldermen; and by the Merchants and Citizens of Halifax. Quite a number of our leading gentlemen attended on the occasion for the purpose of taking leave of His Excellency, who is about to be relieved of his command on this station, and return to Great Britain. They were received with much cordiality by Admiral Milne. The sentiments expressed both in the Addresses and the Replies were such as do honor to those who presented, as well as those who received them.

But few Admirals have gained more sincere respect, and made more warm friends than Admiral Milne has by his unassuming quiet manners and his manly course, whilst in command of Her Majesty's forces in North America and the West Indies. The Citizen's Address was signed by over 1200 merchants and others.

The Rev. Mr. Skinner, pastor of the Baptist church at Raleigh, North Carolina, is now in Halifax on his way to Great Britain and France. Having run the blockade from Wilmington with his lady and three children, they came on here in the Bermuda packet. He preached in Granville street church in the morning, and at the North Baptist church in the evening, on Lord's Day last.

The news by the Adriatic is but little later than previous dates, and not important. Henry Ward Beecher has commanded some attention, by his speeches in favor of the North, and the addresses presented to him. Mr. Mason was again in England.

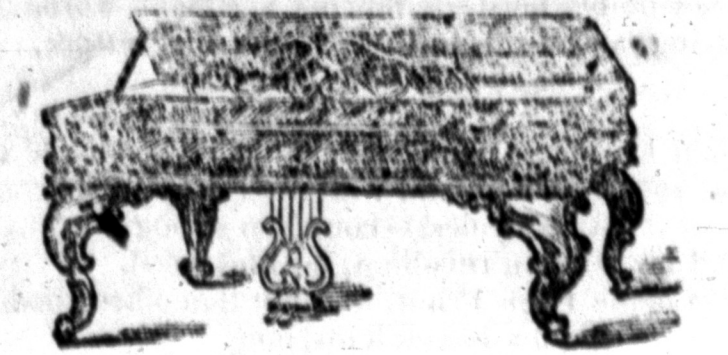

Immigration Office.

THE Government Immigration Office is now open, at 46 Bedford Row, Halifax, where the duties according to the subjoined Act of last Session of the House of Assembly will be attended to and carried on. Persons wishing to engage mechanics and laborers, can call and enter their names and addresses. Immigrants arriving, or who have recently arrived, and requiring aid or information from the Agent, can obtain the same, in so far as lies in his power, by application at the Office.

CHAPTER 26. An Act to provide for the distribution and settlement of industrious immigrants. Passed the 29th day of April, A. D. 1863.

Be it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly as follows:

1. On the passage of this act it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint an Immigrant Agent, with a salary not to exceed eight hundred dollars, who shall have power and whose duties shall be to correspond with the Secretary of the Board of Land and Emigration in London, and with the agents appointed by that Board with the officers of any associations, or with public spirited persons desirous of promoting emigration for the Colonies; and to furnish from time to time such information as may be useful, to enable them to send out emigrants for whom there is likely to be suitable employment in this Province.

To open a brook in which persons wishing to engage mechanics, laborers, and apprentices, can enter their names and addresses. To correspond with County officers, and keep a registry of the distribution of immigrants sent into the interior.

To act as the guardian of orphan children, to bind them as apprentices, and to protect them in case of necessity. To render accounts quarterly to the Financial Secretary, and to make an annual report of his proceedings for the information of the Government and the Legislature.

To act under such instructions as may be issued by the Governor in Council from time to time. 2. The Governor in Council may authorize the Immigrant Agent to draw from the Treasury such sums as may be necessary to temporarily provide for and distribute such immigrants as may be sent into this Province; but no part of the money so drawn shall be disbursed on account of passages to or from this country.

3. Wherever there are tracts of land suitable for settlement, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands, when so instructed by the Governor in Council, to lay them off in one hundred acre lots, with convenient roads running through them, and to place them at the disposal of Immigrant Agent for actual settlement.

4. Whenever such lands are required, either by inhabitants of the province or by industrious immigrants coming into it for actual settlement, surveys shall be made, and the applicants put in possession and allowed a credit of three years for the purchase money, which shall be expended in opening such roads as may be required for the formation and improvement of the settlement, and upon payment grants shall issue.
