THE LAND BILL.—We are happy to see by the last No. of the Royal Gazette that the " Act for settling differences between Landlord and Tenant, and to enable Tenants on certain Townships to purchase the Fee-simple of their farms was assented to by Her Majesty in Council on the 1st of November. The Colonial Minister, Right Hon. Edward Cardwell, specially recommended the Bill for confirmation ; so it appears that the Proprietors have offered no very decided objection to the measure. The Act goes immediately into operation, and we think that Tenants in heavy arrears on the estates of assenting Proprietors must feel themselves relieved of a part of their burden, and one which might have exacted of them at any time, even at the expense of their earthly all.
