NOVA SCOTIA DAY.—Efforts are being made to get up a celebration of the 21st of June, the anniversary of the settlement of Halifax.

THE MINER'S STRIKE AT SYDNEY, C. B. we learn, has come to an end. Most of the men have resumed their work at the mines.

A friction factory has been opened in Mill's Village, Queen's Co.

TELEGRAPHIC.—The American Telegraph Company has presented a claim against the City of Halifax amounting to \$38,500, for expenses incurred by the Company through the opposition made by the Council last year to the erection of telegraph posts at the North End.

SUPREME COURT.—The civil side was occupied for two days with an insurance case—Peter Brush vs. Etna Insurance Company.

JAMES SMITH, a brother to the parties concerned in the late Dartmouth Murder case, was arrested on Thursday, on a charge of stealing two watches, the property respectively of Messrs. Keating and Prioux, shopkeepers, at North End, which had disappeared about a fortnight since.

HORSE-RACING.—We are to have another day of this demoralizing pastime inflicted upon our city. The strong military arm suppressed the worst features common to such exhibitions, last year.

ACCIDENTS AT THE MINES.—We are informed that on Monday last, while some of the workmen were engaged in the old pit, a man named Isaac Phrew, was so seriously injured by the falling of a piece of rock, that he died on the following day.

On Friday a discharge of gas occurred in the cage pit, by which four men were somewhat seriously burned. We understand that their injuries will not prove fatal.

DRUNKENNESS AND ROBBERY.—A countryman named John McAlpine, while lying drunk on the streets, had some £4 taken from his pockets. C. A. Heneberry called at the police station on Sunday night, and reported McAlpine's helpless condition to the police, when he was conveyed to the lock-up.

NEW GLASGOW.—BRUTAL MURDER.—A correspondent of the Reporter under date 19th inst., says: There has been a brutal Murder committed at a place about three miles from New Glasgow, on the post road, between this place and the local River, by a man named John McPhail, who murdered his wife. He first beat her in the house, then dragged her to a brook close by the house, where he threw her into the water.

SUSPICIOUS CASE.—On Tuesday 17th the wife of a man named Daniel O'Connell, who resided in an alley off Salter Street, was found dead in her dwelling. It being suspected that she had been beaten, it was decided to hold an inquest on the body.

THE RAILWAY SURVEY commenced at Abercrombie Point, Pictou County, on the 17th.

THE CITY LIBRARY.—Ald. Nash has made a donation of eighty-two neatly bound volumes, comprising the "British Theatre, the "British Essayist," "Elegant Extracts," and various other valuable and sterling works.

We learn from the Colonist that the Railway Commissioner is making arrangements for special trains to carry passengers and mails to and from Windsor on occasions when the regular trains do not time with the arrival or departure of the steamer.

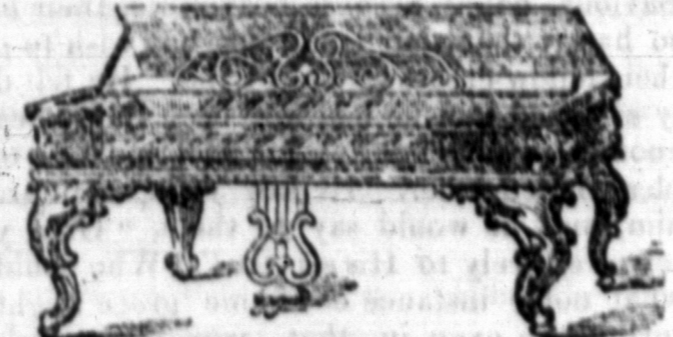

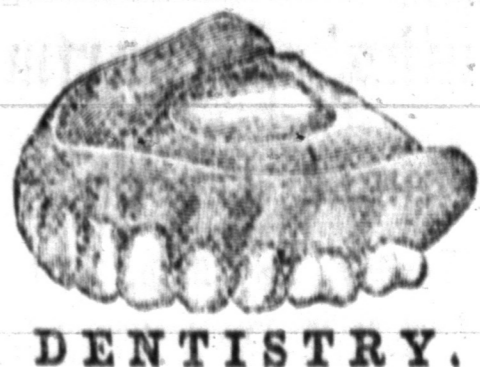
