The Omnibuses start from the city half an hour earlier than the above "Halifax depart," and should arrive in the City about half an hour after the time named "Halifax arrive."

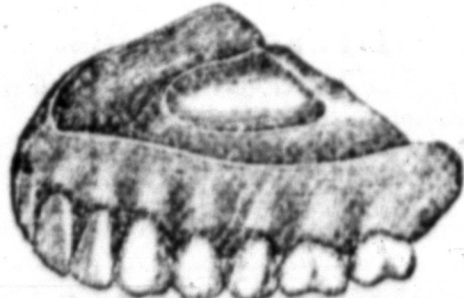

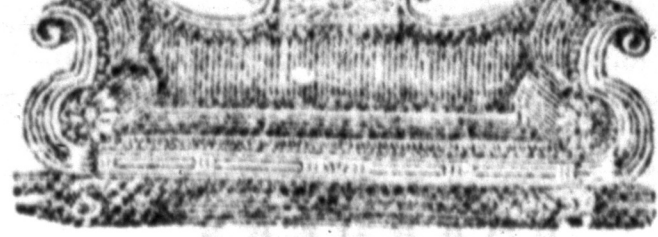

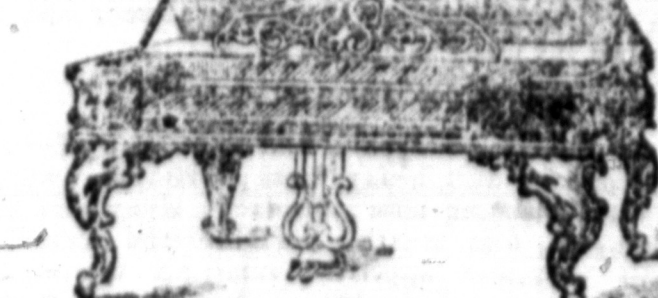
