FRANCE.

The prospects of the French vineyards were said to be excellent. The election for a Deputy at Clermont-Ferrand had resulted in the success of the Opposition candidate.

ITALY.

It is stated that the Pope stipulated for the following conditions before signing a convention with King Victor Emanuel: That the royal exequatur or oath of allegiance should be abolished in the case of the new bishops not belonging to the former Provinces of Sardinia;

EGYPT.

The cholera continued its ravages at Alexandria. The deaths from the disease up to June 20, numbered 1,034.

PRUSSIA.

There was a singular scene in the Prussian Chamber of Deputies on Thursday. It appears that a duel was threatened between M von Bismark and Deputy Virehow, owing to offensive expressions used by the latter during a debate.
