

The Shenandoah has been placed, by the U. States Consul, under the command of Capt. Freeman to be taken to New York.

Capt. Waddell and the crew of the Shenandoah were taken into custody, but had been liberated, the British Government being of opinion that there was no legal ground upon which they could be detained.

Earl Russell has been installed into office as Premier, and Lord Clarendon as Minister of Foreign Affairs.

The French army commenced evacuating Rome on the 6th inst.

A statement is made in the Shipping Gazette that oil springs have been discovered in England.

The Fenian Conspiracy is creating considerable apprehension in Toronto, which is thought to be the centre of these plots against Canada.

The Government Offices and officials have at length been transferred from Quebec to Ottawa, which is hereafter to become the Capital of Canada.

The Hon. George Brown of Toronto, is now on a visit to the Lower Provinces.

His visit it would appear is to confer with the Delegates who are to be present at Washington to negotiate in matters connected with the Reciprocity Treaty, which will expire in March next, and upon the renewal of which much doubt and speculation exist.
