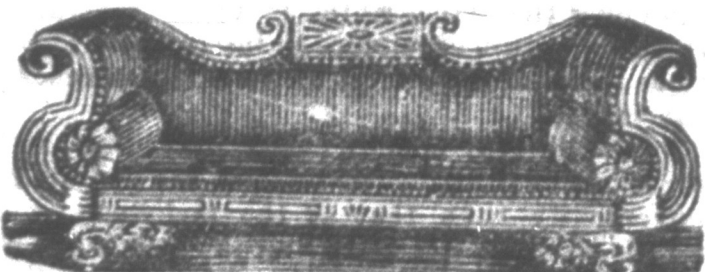
FALL ARRANGEMENT.
