ance of the Papal Power, will now become incapable of lending any effectual support, and Louis Napoleon intimates his fixed intention to withdraw the French troops from Rome. In such case it is believed the great mass of the people of the Roman States will at once declare their adhesion to United Italy, and Pius the Ninth would thus close the line of Popes possessing temporal power, or dominion, and become merely the Spiritual Head of the Roman Catholic Faith.

Commercial affairs in England appear to be regaining their wonted course. The Bank of England baving lowered its rate of discount from 10 to 8 per cent, with hopes of a further reduction, business will no doubt shortly resume its former activity.

The Confederation Delegates from the Maritime Provinces had arrived in England, and had interviews with the Minister for the Colonies, although too late for any definite arrangement of the great object of their mission, to bring the matter before Parliament, which is now prorogued. It is understood, however, that no difficulties are likely to occur, and that the final sanction of the Imperial Parliament will be given to the measure when duly matured by the assembled Delegates with the Home Government, as soon as Parliament meets in January next. It also stated that the British Government have agreed to guarantee four millions sterling for constructing the great Railway between Halifax and Quebec.
