NOTICE TO MARINERS. NOTICE is hereby given, that the Four new Lighthouses erected during the summer in this Province, undermentioned and described, are now and will be in operation from this date until further notice:—

The Light-house on Flint Island, on the eastern coast of the Island of Cape Breton, on the sight of the former light-house, in lat. 46deg. 11min. 5sec. N., lon. 69 deg. 47min. W.; exhibits a Revolving Light 65 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every fifteen seconds.

The Light-house on Green Island, near the south-east end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichat, Cape Breton Island, in lat. 45deg. 28min. 51sec. N., lon. 60deg. 53min. 4sec. W.; is situated on the summit of the Island, and exhibits a Fixed Light, elevated 70 feet above high water. The Lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.
