Alteration in the Scale of Weight for Charging Letters to the United Kingdom.

His Lordship the Postmaster General having proposed an alteration in the Scale of Weight for charging Letters passing between the United Kingdom and Nova Scotia, and the Government of this Province having concurred in the proposed alteration:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That—on and after the 1st of MARCH next, the following alteration in the Scale of Weight for Charging Letters, sent from Nova Scotia to the United Kingdom, will take place:—

A Letter weighing more than one ounce, but under one ounce and a half, will be chargeable with three rates of postage, instead of four as at present, and it exceeding two ounces, but under two ounces and a half, will be chargeable with five rates of postage, instead of six, and so on, adding one rate for every additional half ounce.
