Registration of Births and Deaths.

FINANCIAL SEC. OFFICE, Registration Department.

DUBLIC attention is hereby directed to the sub j ined C auses in the Registration Act :

"Every registration of a Birth shall be made within 60 days after the date thereof, and every person who is by law required to notify or enter for registry any such hirth, who shall fail to do so within said period of 60 days shall be liable to a penalty of Two Dollars."

" Any person who, being required by this chapter to notify or enter for registry, any Death, shall fail to do so within the periods specified (ten days after said death) shall be liable to a penalty of Five Dollars."

All births and deaths are regis ered free of expense at the Regi-tration Office for the City of Halifax, 59 Granville street, and the Deputy Registrar for the City, Stephen Selden, Esq., in common with the other Duputies throughout the Province, have been instructed to enforce the penalty, in every case,
