The ice on the river St. Lawrence at Quebec, started on Friday 20th inst., and in two hours after it started, the ferry steamer was plying across to Point Levi.

UNITED STATE.

NEW YORK, April 30 .- A large fire in New Haven, Conn., on Monday destroyed the New Haven clock manufactory, consisting of six buildings and eleven dwelling houses adjoining; 200 workmen thrown out of employment.

LATEST FROM EUROPE.

By the steamship Herman we learn that the storing away of the Atlantic Cable in the tanks on board the Great Eastern, commenced on the 14th. The laying of the cable will commence in July.

The news from Germany is still less threatening.

An attempt has been made to assassinate the Czar of Russia, but the bullet missed

its aim.

AUSTRIA AND PRUSSIA.

The Independance Belge of April 9 affirms that the Duke of Coburg has communicated directly to the King of Prussia letters of a conciliatory character which he had received from Count Mensdorff. The same paper states posi tively that after a correspondence between the Emperor of Russia and the King of Prussia, the tormer Sovereign sent General Richter to Vienna to call upon Austria to disarm. Austria, it is said, will probably make her disarmament conditional upon Prussia also disarming. It is believed that the intervention of Russia, though it may not lead to any settlement of the difficulty, will nevertheless prevent for some time any further complication. That an assembly should be convened, composed of members directly elected throughout Germany by universal suff are of unusual variety and excellence. rage, to meet upon a day to be appointed, in order to receive proposals to be laid before the German Governments for a reform of the Federal Constitution. 2. That negotiations should in the meantime take place between the various Governments to settle the above proposals."

A telegram, dated Vienna, April 10, states that the Austrian despatch in reply to the Prussian note is short, but moderate in its tone. It demands that the Prussian armaments should be discontinued, and declares that otherwise Austria will call upon the Federal Diet to interfere.

MEXICO.

In consequence of communications exchanged between Marshal Bazaire and the Emperor Maximillan, the Emperor Napoleon has decided that the French troops shall evacuate Mexico in three detachments The first detachment will leave in November, 1866; the second in March, 1867; and the third in November, 1867. Negotiations are being carried on between France and Mexico for substituting for the present financial arrangements of the treaty of Miramar a fresh treaty which shall afford guarantees for the debt owing to France, and for the French interests involved in the Mexican loans.

MISCELLANEOUS.

THE CATTLE PLAGUE IN GREAT BRITAIN -The latest cattle plague return shows that the disease is rapidly dying out. The number of animals attacked in the week ended March 31 was 3,956. Three or four weeks previously the number was over 12,000. An analysis of the preceding cattle plague return shows that of the counties in England, Wales, and Scotland 22 counties remain free from the disease. In 49 counties no cases have been reported as occurring during the week.
