\* HEREAS, for the prevention of Cholera and other infectious disease, strict Sanitany and Quarantine laws are absolutely necessary: I do therefore, by the advice of Her Ma jesty's Executive Council of this Province, hereby order and direct.

1st. That when a vessel shall arrive at any Port of this Province, the Captain shall report to the Pilot or Revenue Officer, all cases of sickness of whatever kind, other than ordinary sea-sickness, that may be on board.

2nd. That the Revenue Officer, or Pilot, shall send should there be no such Officer, to any other duly qualified Medical Practitioner of the place.

3rd. That the captain if need be, shall provide a boat and men to convey such notice, and bring back such Medical Officer or Practitioner, to examine the the case or cases of sickness on board.

4th. That the Health Officer thus notified shall go on board, that use such means as are necessary and proper for their recovery.

B .- In all the Ports in this Province except Halifax, each Health Officer shall be cutitled to demand, in addition to the tees above prescribed, tan cents currency for every mile of aistance from the residence of the Health Officer to the vessel required to be visited, if the discance shall exceed two miles.

The following Quarantine shall be enforced or the Port of Halifax :

1 All vessels shall come to inside of Meagher's Beach, and remain there until boarded by the Health fire a gun, and hoist two vertical lights at the foremast head

2. It shall be the duty of the Medical Officer to board every vessel, day or hight; to examine the log book, and, if necessary, to put the captain or others on board under wath as to any cases of discuse that may have occurred during the voyage, and whether she is from an infected Port.

3. Vessels from disease, and not coming from an infected Port, shall be admitted to Pratique immediately.

4. Any vessel coming from an intected Port, on board of which no case of d sease has occurred, and having been out fourteen days or more, shall be admitted to Pratique; and if under that time, shall be detained in Quarantine until fourteen days have clapsed since the commencement of the voyage.

The foregoing Regulations are applicable to vessels bou d to this Port; but, in all cases when infected vessels put into this Port, the Governor in Council may order them at once to leave the Port, or take such measure consistent with humanity as may be required to prevent the introduction or spread of infection 14

All Pilots and Revenue Officers shall observe, keep. and carry with them copies of these Sanitary and Quarantine Regulations and Instructions thereon. Any violation or disobedience of any of the orders hereby made shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and shall subject the person guilty thereof to a penalty
