Domestic.

THE steamer Empress is to commence her trips between St. John, N. B., and Windsor, to-day Wednesday.

Maple sugar will probably be very abundant this season. The work of collecting has already commenced in some places.

TWO FIRES occurred on Saturday night last. One of a barn near the Railway Depot which was burned to the ground; the other at Mr. John Pugh's store in Bedford Row where much damage was done by the water in putting out the fire.

LIVERPOOL.—The fifty years' lease of the Liverpool Toll Bridge expired on Friday last. It is fifty-one years since the act to erect the bridge was passed.

The prospectus of the Liverpool Transcript, issued in 1854, had the following expression on Confederation:—The Transcript will bear in mind that, probably, under the blessing of Divine Providence, the period is destined to arrive when these colonies of British North America will, in their united capacity, form a distinct and independent nation, or several free and independent ones, not by the violent shock of revolution, but by attaining to constitutional growth and maturity.

AMHERST.—An inquest was held on Thursday before Dr. Crane, Coroner, on the body of a new born male child, found dead. The verdict of the jury was "died from willful exposure by the mother, or by strangulation."

New Brunswick.

THE TEMPERANCE CAUSE PROGRESSING.—We rejoice to learn from all quarters that the Temperance Reform in New Brunswick is rapidly advancing. The Sons and the Good Templars are unusually active, and are reaping a rich harvest of converts as the result.

THE BANKS OF ST. JOHN have been subjected to a run—not a raid—upon them. The fact of the Westmoreland Branch having closed, led parties to believe a rumor of a similar thing being likely to occur at St. John.

Canada.

TORONTO, C. W., March 27.—Orders have been received from Ottawa ordering the Volunteers to drill twice a week. The Queens Own Regt. was inspected by Major General Stisted this afternoon. The Stipendiary Magistrate at Clifton Suspension Bridge has issued a circular stating that a number of the Provincial Police have been detailed for the protection of strangers.

THE main portion of Bothwell, C. W., was in ashes on the 19th, over one hundred houses have been destroyed. A large number of families have been rendered houseless and destitute, and they are leaving the town by every train in all directions.

The Fenian leaders are still levying on their dupes in the United States. Mass meetings of them are held in some of the principal cities. Our Canadian contemporary remarks respecting the pandering of politicians to the villains: "The passive sympathy of the United States Government with these ruffians has caused such indignation in Canada, that the annexation feeling is thoroughly crushed out."

A Montreal despatch of the 25th inst., states that the proclamation putting the act of Union in force in the British North American Provinces will not be issued until the Delegates return home; and they will have to appoint the Senators whose names are to appear in the Proclamation.

OTTAWA, C. W., March 31.—A message received by the cable to day from Prov. Secretary McDougall states that the Intercolonial Railway guarantee bill passed the Committee of the House of Commons by a large majority, and that the Confederation Bill has received the Royal assent.

Active preparations are being made to increase the tariff on lumber this season.
