

Between thirty and forty counterfeiters of United States currency and treasury notes, were arrested yesterday in the western part of this State, and a large quantity of their paper seized.

PHILADELPHIA, April 3.—The extensive woolen mills of A. B. Schofield at Manyunk, were burned last night. Loss \$160,000—insured \$18,000.

LATEST FROM EUROPE.

ENGLAND.—London, April 1st.—The figures of the budget laid before the House of Commons show that the revenue of Great Britain for the last fiscal year exceeds the expenditure by £25,000,000.

April 2nd.—In House of Lords last night the Duke of Buckingham, Colonial Secretary, said that the prospective transfer of the Russian North American Possessions to the United States was a matter of indifference to England.

April 4.—The annual Budget was presented to Parliament to day. The excess of receipts over expenditure for last year, and balance remaining in exchequer officially stated at two and a half million pounds.

April 5.—The Budget laid before the House of Commons last night by Mr. Disraeli, gives general satisfaction, and is well received by the Press and members of Parliament.

April 7.—At a meeting of the Liberal members of Parliament, it was resolved to offer a determined opposition to the Reform Bill introduced by the Government.

IRELAND.—Dublin, April 2nd.—A despatch from Cork reports that a fight took place in the vicinity of that city this morning between the troops and a band of Fenians, and that several of the rebels were taken prisoners.

FRANCE.—The French Exhibition was opened on Monday by the Emperor in person. The arrangements are not yet very incomplete.

Prussia.—Brussels, March 31.—Placards hostile to Prussia and favoring an alliance with France, have been posted up in the streets of Luxembourg. The Prussian commander of the Fortress of Luxembourg has complained of the insult offered to his government.

Berlin, April 5. The North German Parliament will adjourn on the 5th. The Prussian Government is about to raise a loan of thirty million thalers.

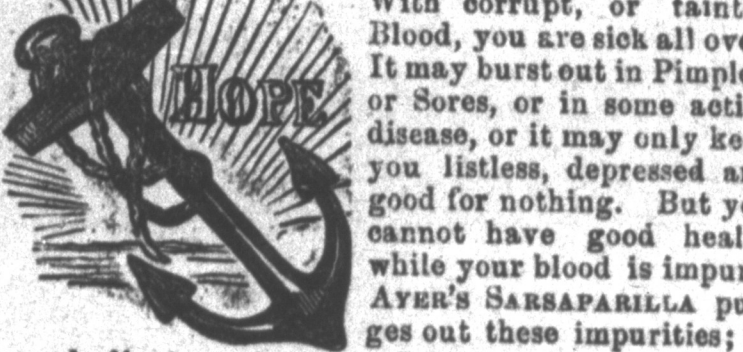
