Between thirty and forty counterfeiters of United States currency and treasury notes, were arrested yesterday in the western part of this State, and a large quantity of their paper seized.

PHILADELPHIA, April 3.-The extensive woolen mills of A. B. Schofield at Manyunk, were burned last night. Loss \$160,000-insured \$18,000.

We observe by late American papers that the United States Government will pay seven millions of dollars for the Russian Possessions in North America.

SPARROWS .- Ten years ago a few individuals in New York commenced to import small numbers of English sparrows, in the hope that they would multiply, and check the increase of caterpillars and insects, which were destroying many kinds of trees and shrubs. The number imported was not large, and they being so combative it was necessary for success to bring them over in separate cages; yet, the few have increased to hundreds of thousands ; flocks of them may be seen in the streets of New York and Brooklyn, and they are gradually spreading over the surrounding country.

LATEST FROM EUROPE.

ENGLAND.-London, April 1st.-The figures ot the budget laid before the House of Commons show that the revenue of Great Britain for the last fiscal year exceeds the expenditure by £25, 000,000.

April 2nd.-In House of Lords last night the Duke of Buckingham, Colonial Secretary, said that the prospective transfer of the Russian North American Possessions to the United States was a matter of indifference to England.

April 4 .- The annual Budget was presented to Parliament to day. The excess of receipts over expenditure for last year, and balance remaining in exchequer officially stated at two la Ronciere, from Havana; H. I. M. S. Magnamme, and a halt million pounds. The estimated income for present year will exceed sixty nine million pounds and the estimated expenditure is sixty eight-million pounds. It is proposed by the Government to retain the present tax on Hopewell, Ormiston, Cow Bay; Robert Nobie, Ormait and to impose a low duty on marine assurances, and also on annuities. April 5.- The Budget laid before the House of Commons last night by Mr. Disraeli, gives general satisfaction, and is well received by the Press and members of Parliament.


