WEALTH FOR NOVA SCOTIANS.—It is reported that by the death of a bachelor member of the Rothschild firm, named Gore, a fortune of seventy-five millions of Dollars, invested in Holland, has been left to his descendants; two of his sisters, it is understood, lived in this province.

A beautiful steam-yacht of 15 horse power, named the Gipsy, was launched at Milton on Saturday morning. On her trial trip she attained a speed of 8 miles per hour.—Yarmouth Tribune.

LIQUOR LICENCES IN HALIFAX CITY.—At a late meeting of the City Council, it was resolved to fix the scale of license duty as follows:—Hotel, Saloon, Inn or Confectionary \$100; shop \$100, and tavern, in which nothing but liquor should be sold, \$50.

At a meeting held on Wednesday the matter was reconsidered, and after some discussion the Council decided to amend the scale, and finally fixed it as follows, by a vote of 8 to 3. Hotel saloon or Confectionary, \$60, shop \$50, and tavern \$40.

THE TAXES ON LIQUORS.—The Revenue collected on Intoxicating Liquors and Tobacco for the year ended 30th Sept., 1866, was \$240,000, or nearly one fifth of the whole Revenue of the Province, making an average of 68 cents per head for every man, woman, and child in Nova Scotia.

HALIFAX AND PORTLAND.—B. Wier Esq., agent for the Grand Trunk Railway, has made an agreement with the Portland Steam Packet Company for ten years, from 15th February last to keep up steam communication between Portland and Halifax.

OUR DEFENCES.—We understand, upon good authority, that the Military authorities are in treaty for the purchase of a considerable portion of McNab's Island, for the purpose of erecting fortifications thereon.

STEAM.—We are informed that the late blockade running steamer Secret, has been purchased by a Canadian Company, who intend placing her on the route between Pictou and the Maritime Provinces.

The "Blue Bell" tavern was entered by the Police on Tuesday night of last week, and three females were arrested. Four others who were in the house escaped by the back window.

TANGIER is looking up in its late yields of gold.

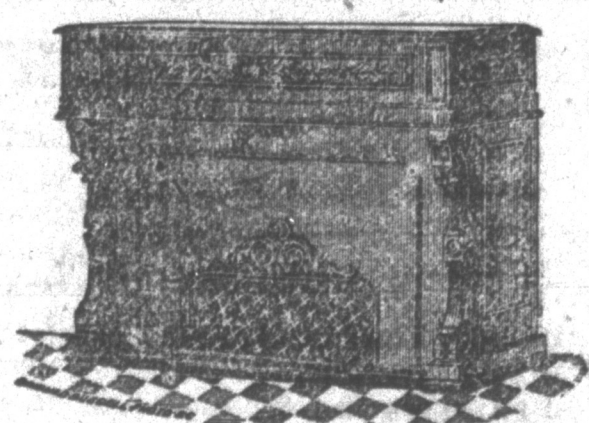
