GENTLEMEN,-


AVING been nominated at a large and influential meeting of the Electors of the County as a Candidate for the General Parliament at Ottawa, I beg now most respectfully to solicit your suffrages at the ensuing Election.

For the eight years during which I have been honored by your generous confidence and support, I have endeavoured to study and advance your interests, while I have had some humble share in promoting the prosperity of the country. Fortunately the most determined efforts of this extraordinary combination could not bar you from the privileges which you are to secure at so early a day.


