late in the season; for after the blades of of the grass are killed, these animals will nip close to get sweet feed. They never should be allowed upon mowing land after the grass has stopped growing, not even in winter when the ground is frozen, for they will then goaw to the very roots.

Horned cattle are really the only fit animals for the meadow, and they should be turned in while the feed is good, and removed as soon as the earth becomes moist enough for their feet to break the sod. In this way a profit may be derived on one hand, without any loss attending on the other, and sufficient protection left for roots. Timothy, and many other grasses which are common, take strong hold upou the soil, and are difficult to eradicate, and for this reason farmers abuse their fields.

Close feeding kills out here and there a a little, and mosses, with other foreign matters, work in so gradully that it is for a few


