Treatment of Clay Land.

I had a patch of hard clay land in one of my fields, containing about half an acre; it was so hard that we could not plough it with two horses, and when it was ploughed, it came up in large lumps from one foot long to three; the harrow would bound and bounce along over it, and you could not see where it had been; we could not plant it for the lumps.

THE LAST MILK FROM THE UDDER.—D. Anderson says he has found by practical analysis in one instance that the last cup of milk drawn from the cow's udder contained sixteen times as much cream as the first one.

GATHERING FRUIT.—The appearance and the value of fruit depend very much upon when and how it is gathered.

Pears and apples should never be picked from the tree by breaking the stems. Unless the stem will separate freely from the tree, the fruit is not ripe; will neither eat nor cook good, and is only fit for those who want a touch of the cholera morbus.

For profit, and in order to obtain the highest price, all fruit pays to be assorted into two or more grades. A few scattering large berries, or pears in a quart or bushel, do not assist in advancing the price; but if carefully packed by themselves will bring the highest price, and often induce the dealer to buy the small fruit in order to get the large.—Horticulturist.

An Ohio exchange says something is the matter with the bees this summer. They refuse to send out swarms, or make any honey.

All wrinkled peas, says an exchange, are superior to, and more delicate in flavor than those that present a full and perfect form; like sugar corn, the saccharine matter which they contain cause them to shrivel when dried.
