Agriculture, &c.,

House Plants.

Do not remove the plants to the hove, until there is danger of frost; and then give them abundance of air and light.

Perhaps the greatest obstacle to success in window gardening lies in the dryness of the air.

As to watering and ventilating, discrimination should be used. As a general rule, water should be given copiously enough to wet the entire ball of soil; wetting simply is not enough.

Stir the soil often with a small stick when it is dry. If insects appear, pick them off or kill them by fumigating.

Tree Planting.—In planting trees this fall, all should remember that it is requisite to set the tree only just so deep as to enable it to stand.

An experiment made last year in Germany, in planting potatoes, showed that where the eyes had first been removed, the yield was four times as great as where they were left in their places.
