

As a forage crop, its special value is in the quantity and quality of the hay that it produces, and the rapidity with which it comes to maturity after being sown. Thus a clover field becomes, as it were, a great commissary, collecting food from the earth and the air for whatever crop that may follow.

4th. By preventing washing. The Clover mulch breaks the force of the hard beating rains, while the roots hold the soil in a mat as it were, thus preventing from washing.

5th. As a green manure. Perhaps no crop is so valuable for turning under in a green stage, as Clover. In addition to the immense amount of rich vegetable matter in its abundant roots, the plant itself is extremely rich in all the materials necessary to the healthful growth of succeeding crops.-Dixie Farmer.


