" From Annapolis town, that is, the terminus of the present line of Railway, the continuation would procably be up the valley of Allen's asiver for a few miles thence in a southwesterly direction crossing the upper waters of Moose River and Bear River towards the Head waters of the main branch of Tusket Rivers, near Kemptville in Yarmouth Country; thence through a fine agricultural district and nearly ou the same course to Yarmouth Harbour.

The principal part of the line, from Annapolis to Bear River, is through granted land, c ossing a band of lower Devonian Rocks, in which there is a conformable bed of iron ore, about 6 feet in thickness, and of great extent and value It is said to contain about 56 per cent. of iron. and although not worked at present, will be of considerable value when railway communication is obtained, as the ore could then be carried to coal or coal to the ore. Heretotore the smelting of this ore was carried on with charcoal, which in the immediate neighbourhood became scarce, and the works in consequence were abandoned ; but no doubt exists either as to the value, quan tity or quality of the ore.

From Bear River outward to Yarmouth the la: d is to a large extent ungranted and contains a considerable growth of spruce, pine and hardwood, in many parts capable of profitable cultivation. The geological formation is upper Silurian. Along this region the Government could with great propriety, set apart about 150,000 acres of wilderness land for the encouragement ot a Railroad.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

ON the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Customs, and under and in virtue of the authority given by the 10th section of the Act passed during the late Session of the Parliament of Canada, 31st Vic. Cap 44, intituled: - An Act to amend the Act of the present Session, intituled: "An Act imposing duties of Customs with the tariff of duties payable under it." His Excellency in Council has been pleased to approve of the following additional Regulations respecting Drawbacks claimed on the exportation of good : under the suid 10th section of the Act above referred to, viz:-

REGULATIONS.

1st. Goods having been entered for duty and having passed into the hands of the importer, in cases where the said goods are found not to be the goods ordered, notice of such fact may be given to the Collector of Customs at the Port of Entry, within one month of the date of such entry, accompanied bp a request for leave to return the said goods to the place and party where and from whom the same were purchased, and that the duties raid thereon be refunded; whereupon the collector having verified the statement of the importer, and having ascertained that the package to be expor ed is a whole package, and that its contents are identically the same as originally entered for duty, shall report the same to the Department, and the Minister of Customs shall thereupon issue an order to the Collector to refund the duties upon due proof of exportation; Provided tha if such goods are not actually exported within one month from the date of such order it shall be void and of no effect.

2nd. Whereas cases frequently arise for which no general order or regulation is provided, in which goods upon which duty has been paid require to be exported, and injury or hardship may be en-dured by importers, to the disadvantage of the general commercial interests of the Dominion, unless some means of redress he provided. It is therefore ordered that in all such special cases, it shall be lawtul for the Minister of Customs to consider the grounds and examine the merits of each application, and make such order thereupon subject to the approval of the Treasury Board; as may, in his judgment be necessary for the relief of the parties, and e onsistent with the interest and security of the rev-





HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PRESENT :

Whereas it is provided by Cap 5, of the Act 31st Vic., Sec 10, sub sec 5, that " the Governor in Council may make such regulations as may be considered advisable for the ap, oin ment of Sufferance Wharves and Warchouses at which goods arriving by vessels in transit to other Ports or confined to certain days of departure, may be landed and afterwards stored before entry;" And whereas it is expedient that the accomodation so contemplated should be afforded in all cases where the sumemay found necessary,-His Excellency in Council, on the recommendation of the Honorable the Min ster of Customs, and under the authority of the said recited Act has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered, that on application te the Minister of Customs, by the owner or master of any Packet Steamer, or other vessel being a regular trader, specifying the name and tonnage of the said steamer or other vessel, the general time of her arrival and departure, and he ports between which she is accustomed to sail, also designating the wharf at which she is accustomed to land and the building in which it is proposed to store her cargo, it shall be lawful for the said Minister of Customs to declare the said wharf and building to be a sufferance wharf and warehouse or the purposes of the Act, and to authorize the Collector of the port to grant a warrant of lisense, for a specified time, to the master of such steamer or other vessel to land his cargo and store- the same at the wharf and in the building so declared to be a sufferance wharf and warehouse, without previous entry, the said Master having previously executed a bond to the Crown in such penal sum as the said Minister of Customs may consider equitable, but not less than one thousand dollars, providing that the said Master will not fail to leave in the hands of the Landing Waiter or other Officer of Customs appointed for the purpose, a report of the Contents of his vessel for each voyage, and he will in all other respects. conform to the requirement. of the law in such case, and will use his utmost diligence to prevent any infraction thereof by any person or persons arriving at such port in his vessel.
