Agriculture, &c.,

Keep the Surface of the Ground loose.

We have many years watched the varied results of the cultivator who keeps frequently stirring the sur ace of his soil, and the one who hoes or cultivates only when the weeds compel him to the work; and as we have watched and recorded our notes, the result has always been in favor of the constant stirring of the surface soil. We do not advocate deep tillage in the growing season, but we would have the ground deeply and thoroughly stirred early in the season, whether it were an old or new plantation. Once however, that vigorous growth of top and root has commenced, all deep tillage should cease, because, by pursuing it constant and continued cheeks are given, and a truly healthy growth prevented by repeated breaking and tearing asunder the roots and fibers the supplying pipes for elongation, expansion, and evaporation of the branches and leaves. By repeated surface stirring of the soil, however, no roots are broken; the sun, air, and moisture are enabled to penetrate and assist in the ehemical transmutation of the earth's compounds and fitting them for absorption by the roots.—Horticulturist.

Of the great value of root crops for feeding to milch cows, sheep, and to some extent to other stock, there is no question; but while corn can be raised so much more easily and cheaply as it can in the West, it is likely to continue to be more popular and the favoite feed of stock. Again, root crops generally do not succeed so well in this latitude as they do further north. The ruta baga at the north yields immense crops, out here we have never known it to do a quarter as well, and frequently nearly fails entirely .-Journal of Agriculture.

SHADE TREES.—Several enterprising young cities pay the owner of a lot a dollar for every shade tree he plants along the side-

If a farmer in Wisconsin plants a row of trees along the road he is exempt from the road tax. Whoever hurts one of the little ones is fined \$5; and the State Horticultural Society offers a premium of \$100 for the best ten acres of forest trees, and \$50 for the second best.
