



In view of the superior quality and higher value of winter wheat, is it not wise to sow it, even though some risk is run of failure? The loss of seed is all that is hazarded, for the preparation of the ground is so much clear gain, even it it is found needful ultimately to sow spring wheat.

September is the month during which most of the Agricultural Exhibitions are held. It should never be deemed lost time, wasted money, or mere holiday-keeping to attend these. Much useful information may be obtained at such places, that is, provided those who go keep their eyes and ears open .--" Eyes and no eyes," might be the title of a descriptive account of the manner in which two classes of persons, the observant and unobservant, demean themselves at shows.
