LATEST FROM EUROPE.

ENGLAND.—London, Aug. 19.—Representatives of France, Holland, Belgium, Prussia, and England, are now assembled at the Hague (Holland), for the purpose of holding Conference looking to equalization of sugar duties.

Advices from Hong Kong to July 10th have reached England via Calcutta. At Hong Kong the commission appointed to consider the subject, reported against granting licenses by the Colonial Government for gambling.

Crop reports from Calcutta to 22d July, have been received. They state that Cotton in the North Western Districts of India has suffered from heavy rains, and the yield in that part of the country will fall below the estimates of the planters.

Aug. 22.—A train of cars from Holyhead, containing the passengers and mails from Ireland which was proceeding towards Liverpool at the usual rate of speed, met with a bad accident today at the little town of Abergelie, in the county of Denbigh.

FRANCE.—A Paris despatch on the 20th inst says that at the review of the troops at Marseilles yesterday, which attracted an immense crowd of citizens, a popular demonstration was made for peace.

SWITZERLAND.—Lucerne, Aug. 21.—It having become known to the Swiss authorities that an attempt was intended upon the life of the Queen of England, during her recent sojourn in this place, a strict search was made by the police for parties concerned in the diabolical plot.
