Keeping Poultry in Orchards.

Some farmers make it a practice to keep their poultry in their orchards from early in the spring until cold weather sets in, and they find it pays them for so doing. A picket fence should be built around the orchard high enough to prevent their flying over, with a suitable house, or shed, in one corner of the yard to shelter them at night.
