TEA CULTURE IN CALIFORNIA.

California boasts that she is soon not only to be independent of the outside world as regards tea, but will have plenty to spare for her less fortunate ne ghbors. A great quantity of the seed-nuts of the tea-plant have been planted at the ranch just purchased for a Japanese colony, and are coming up finely. The foot-hill lands of the State are said to approach very nearly to those of Japan in adaptability to tea culture. In North Japan, whence these plants were brought, deep snows prevail about sixty days in winter, and the plant requires frost to give repose to their organ of growth. The tea-plant furnishes other valuable commodities to commerce, beside its leaves. China oil, than which no oil burns cleaner, is extracted from the tea nut, as is also a sort of wax highly valued. The wax is obtained from the nuts by boil ing and mashing them, the wax separating readily. Varnish is the circulating fluid of the tree. Hearth and Home.

USE OF LEMONS.

When persons are feverish and thirsty beyond what is natural, indicated in some cases by a metallic taste in the mouth, especially after drinking water, or by a whitish appearance of the greatest part of the tongue, one of the best " coolers," internal or external, is to take a lemon. cut off the the top, sprinkle over it some loaf-sugar, working it down into the lemon, with a spoon, and then suck it slowly, squeezing the lemon, and adding more sugar as the acidity increases, from being brought up from a lower point. Invalids with feverishness may take two or three lemons a day in this manner, with the most marked benefit, manifested by a sense of coolness, comfort, and invigoration. A lemon or two, thus taken at tea-time, as an entire substitute for the ordinary supper of summer, would give many a one a comfortable night's sleep, and an awakening of rest and invigoration, with an appetite for breakfast, to which they are strangers who will have their cup of tea and a hearty supper.



Mr. Willard says, in the Utica Herald We have often wondered why men of a naturally saving disposition, who would be shocked to see a pint of milk spilled in the milk-house, should allow quarts and gallons to be lost in the bad management of the herd in the stable, kicking cows with heavy boots, striking with stools and keeping the animals in a constant strain of nervous excitement and fear. We have no doubt that the quality as well as the quantity of milk is influenced by undue excitement and nervous agitation. It must be in the experience of every one familiar with practical. dairying, that cows will lessen their milk when frightened ; that they will do this for days in succession if the fright be continued. It has been noticed that any unusual noise or disturbance will have an effect. 
