THE TIDES .- The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at Parraboro', Corn-wallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windson, Newport, and Truro.

High water at Pictou and Cape Tormentine 2 hours and 30 minutes later than at flaiffax. At Annapolis, St John, N. B., and Portland Mainn, 3 hours and 44 minutes later, and at St. John's, New-foundland 1 hour carlier, than at Halifax.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE BAY .- Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sun substract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT -Substract the time of the sun's seiting from 12 hours, and to the remainder add the time of 'rising next morning.






