2nd .- The drying sh Il be done under the personal i spection of the Officer of Excise detailed for that

3rd .- The owner of the grain or drying kiln shall pay to the C Hector of Inland Revenue, such sum as shall be sufficient to cover the expense incurred in the survey of drying damaged grain;

4th -It will be the duty of the Officer to examine closely, and asce: tain whether the damaged grain is germinating, and if it be, to report the same to the Collector forthwith.
