Agriculture, &c.,

CHEAP VEGETABLE CELLAR. -Sink a barrel two thirds of its depth into the ground (a box or cask will answer a better purpose); heap the earth around the part projecting out of the ground with a slope on all sides; place the vegetables that you desire to keep in the vessel; cover the top with a water tight cover; and when winter sets in, throw an armful of straw, hay, or something of the sort, on the barrel. If the bottom is out of the cask or barrel it will be better. Cabbages, celery and other vegetables will keep in this way as fresh as when taken from the ground. The celery should stand nearly perpendicular, celery and earth alternating. Freedom from frost, ease of access, and especially freshness and freedom from rot, are the advantages claimed .- Journal of Horticulture.

VICK'S ILLUSTRATED CATALOGUE AMD FLORAL Guide.-We have received from Mr. James Vick, of Rochester, N. Y., a copy of his beautiful catalogue of seeds for 1869. It extends over 100 pages, and contains a large number of illustrations, including a coloured frontispiece. Besides a very full list of garden seeds, it gives brief practical directions for the culture of flowers and vegetables. In completeness and typographical execution it is a model catalogue.

To Purify Lard from Salt, which it often contains, and which is sometimes added to increase its weight, it is only necessary to melt it with two or three times its weight of boiling water, and when still in a liquid state, agitate it well and set it aside to cool. When lard is wanted for ointments or pomades, it is always desirable to free it from all traces of salt.

THE BEST GRASS FOR BUTTER.-If you aim at a great flow of milk, feed young timothy and white clover; if you aim at the best results both in quantity and quality of butter, feed on fresh pastures of white clover and timothy in summer, and early-cut timothy and wheat bran in winter. The grass must be cut when heading out; or, better, young aftermath well cured. Avoid roots and garden stuff in general, if you wish a good quality of butter-though it is now held that those fed while milking, or immediately before, will remedy the evil.—Valley Farmer.

A gentleman in Detroit has discovered a means of applying steam power to street cars in such a way that there will be neither smoke nor sparks, nor more noise than is made by a sewing machine. The discovery has been tested in Detroit, and found to work well, and it will probably be introduced on our city railroads. Besides its cheapness, it offers the advantage of heating the cars by steam pipes in cold weather, an advan-tage that must be appreciated by all who stamp the toes out of their boots in street cars in vain attempts to keep out the frost.

We understand that the lowering of the musical pitch in England is shortly about to assume practical form. The letter of Mr. Sims Reeves, addressed to the Athenaum, in which he positively refuses to sing at the Sacred Harmonic Society whilst the present high pitch is maintained, has decided the matter; and as most of the competent musicans of the country are, to our knowledge, ranged on his side, there can be little doubt that, whatever may be the difficulties to be overcome, the change must be made.-Musical Times.

Fresh Sausage-Meat.—Take fat and lean pork. cut off the rind and chop fine. Season as follows: To twenty pounds of meat add seven ounces of salt, two ounces of sage, and two heaped up table spoonsful of ground black pepper. Mix with the hand and pack it up in jars. Place a cloth, after it has been dipped in melted butter, over the meat; or pour melted suct over. Put a board over the jar, and set it in a cool place.

A NEW CAR-WHEEL has been invented, which is designed to be less liable to breakage, to be greater protection to the axles, and to make the cars ride easier. The web and the hub are made saparately, a ring of rubber is interspersed be tween them, and the parts are then firmly bolted together.

A method of sewing boots and shoes with copper wire, instead of the common thread, has been patented, the advantage being that at a very small increase in expense the strength and durability of the work are much improved.

The Journal of Chemistry says that two or three drops of carbolic acid to a bottle of ink will prevent mouldiness; and about thirty drops added to a pint of water used for making paste will prevent its moulding. Carbolic acid, however, is a poison, and should be used with care It is very destructive to the lower orders of vegetable and animal life.
