STOCK-RAISING.

Raise only so many as can be well fed and attended to, say four calves to every six cows kept on the farm.

In winter give the calves a warm shed to shelter them, plenty of good clean straw to lie on and nibble at.

The secret of success in raising horned stock is to crowd them on, gently at first but more fully as they get older.

CURIOUS PHENOMENON.

"How is it you raise so large and nice onions?" I asked of an Iowa farmer, as I was sitting at the table with him.

"Well, you try it," he replied grinningly, "when the time comes to plant, and you'll find it just as I tell you."

I looked, and beheld the little sprouts about as large as horse hairs, were shooting out of the opened ends of the seed!

Those keeping horses should, twice a week, throw in a handful of salt and ashes. Mix them by putting three parts of salt to one of ashes.

THE TIDES.—The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at Parrsboro', Cornwallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, and Truro.

High water at Pictou and Cape Tormentine 2 hours and 30 minutes later than at Halifax.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of the sun's setting from 12 hours, and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.
