Magenta or Rosine, Magdaia Pink, Crimson, Scarlet, Purple, Blue, Violet, light and deep Yellow, Green, Brown, and Ponceau Scarlet. Green requires pure wool in order to succeed, part cotton flannel wool take it. Most of them dissolve freely in hot water, others have to be first dissolved in a little spirit, and then added to the boiling water.

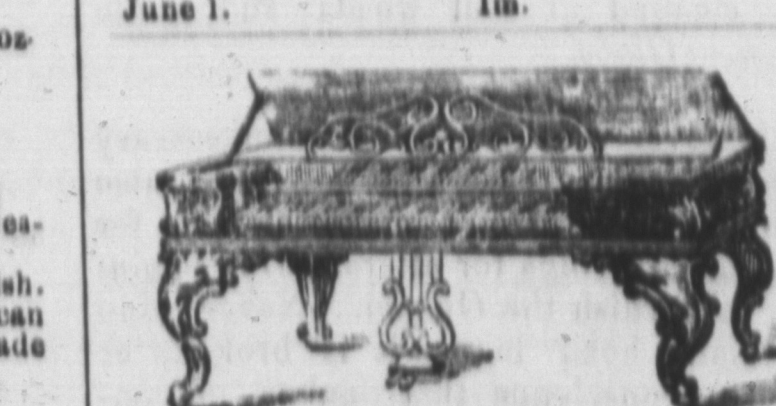
On and after WEDNESDAY, 1st June, 1870, Trains will run as follows:—
