ROBBERY.—A quantity of tea and tobacco, and some guernsey shirts were stolen from the store of Mr. Charles E. Wiswell, on Lower Water Street early on Thursday morning last.

THE GRAND DIVISION Sons of Temperance will hold its Annual Session in Halifax commencing on Tuesday evening Nov. 1st at 8 o'clock, p. m.

FOUR OARED RACE.—At a meeting of the Halifax Yacht Club, held on Friday, it was resolved that an effort be made to raise \$7,000 to defray the expenses of training a four oared crew to challenge the world for a race on Halifax harbor in August next.

A horse owned by a Mr. Herbert fell over O'Neill's wharf on Wednesday last and was drowned.

On Wednesday last four boys were removed from the City Prison reformatory to the Halifax Protestant Industrial School, to be supported by the city, in accordance with the terms of the Dominion Act.

THE CENSUS.—John Costley Esq., of the statistics department and Amos Purdy Esq., M. P. for Cumberland, have been appointed joint commissioners for superintending the taking of the Census in Nova Scotia, and have gone to Ottawa for instructions.

Robert Donkin, Esq., ex M. P. for Cumberland, has been appointed Warden of the Provincial Penitentiary.

DR. HONEYMAN advocates the establishment of a Provincial "School of Mines" for imparting that scientific and practical knowledge which is necessary for skillful and successful mining works, for the purpose of rendering the profession more remunerative and certain.

BREACH OF REVENUE LAW.—The Windsor Mail states that it is reported that a seizure of fourteen schooners has been made by Mr. Kerr, Customs Detective, in the Counties of Kings and Annapolis, for violating the act respecting Customs, 31 Vict. Cap. 10.

GRIEVOUS ASSAULT.—The Windsor Mail has information that a young man named Anely Elliott, residing at Port George, Annapolis County, while digging potatoes in his field on Tuesday last, was approached by two men who sought to pick a quarrel.

The Court of Sessions at Windsor have decided to grant licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors.

OUR FISHERIES.—We had the pleasure last week of conversing with a gentleman from Port Latour, who informed us that the "take" in that vicinity the past season, had exceeded anything he ever remembered, that this result was directly attributable to the action of the Dominion cruisers in compelling foreign fishermen to keep their distance.

ANTAGONISM.—At the Supreme Court here on Tuesday last, there was but one indictment—an assault on a constable. Judge McCully soon disposed of this and proceeded with the summary and appeal causes of which there was quite a number.

The "Churel" family, of Hants County have formed an association to prosecute their claims to a large estate in Wales.

A colored man named Dixon fell into a pond at Annapolis on Sunday the 9th while in a fit and was drowned.

AMHERST.—The Supreme Court was opened here on Wednesday last, Judge Ritchie presiding. There was but one criminal case—larceny. The Grand Jury and Bar presented congratulatory addresses to the Judge who gave to each an appropriate reply.

COLCHESTER CO. ELECTION.—Tuesday, November 1st, is appointed nomination day for the Colchester election, and the following Tuesday for taking the poll.

SALE OF SALT WORKS.—The property at Antigonish, belonging to the Nova Scotia Salt Works Company was sold at auction on Friday last by J. D. Nash, and realized \$2,710, W. C. Moir, Esq., was the purchaser.

DROWNED.—A son of Mr. James Taylor, of Bridgewater, three years of age, was drowned near his father's residence a few days ago. The little fellow fell from a wharf into the river.

Samuel Caldwell, who, some weeks since, so severely assaulted and injured Wm Phalen, on the Chester Road, that he subsequently died from the effects of the beating, has given himself up to the authorities in Hants County.
