

CANADIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION.—At the Convention of this Association held at Ottawa last week, the Hon. Dr. Parker of Halifax was chosen President, the Hon. Dr. Tupper, C. E., having declined offering for re-election. Dr. R. S. Black, was elected Vice-President for Nova Scotia, and Dr. A. P. Reid, Secretary for this Province. Dr. Wm. Bayard, was chosen Vice-President for New Brunswick, and Dr. J. T. Steeves, Secretary for that Province.

FATAL ACCIDENTS.—The Pictou Standard reports that a young man named John Robert Porter, belonging to the Middle River, Pictou, was killed on Saturday last, by falling from a bridge about thirty feet high, now being built by the Nova Scotia Coal Company. Last week at Rollo Bay, P. E. Island, Mr. Neil McNevin, while working in a shipyard, got jammed between two pieces of timber, and was so badly injured that he died the next day. On the 5th inst., Mr. D. Dounette, of Rustico, P. E. Island, was drowned at that place by the upsetting of a boat.

ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION.—A short time ago a young gentleman belonging to Cornwallia was driving in the vicinity of Perceux, at an early hour of the night. While passing a secluded spot he was fired at by some person concealed in the bushes. Fortunately for the traveller he was leaning against the side of the seat, his head resting on his hand. The ball passed through his hat but did not harm him. The horse took fright and ran away, and the driver saw nothing of his assailant.

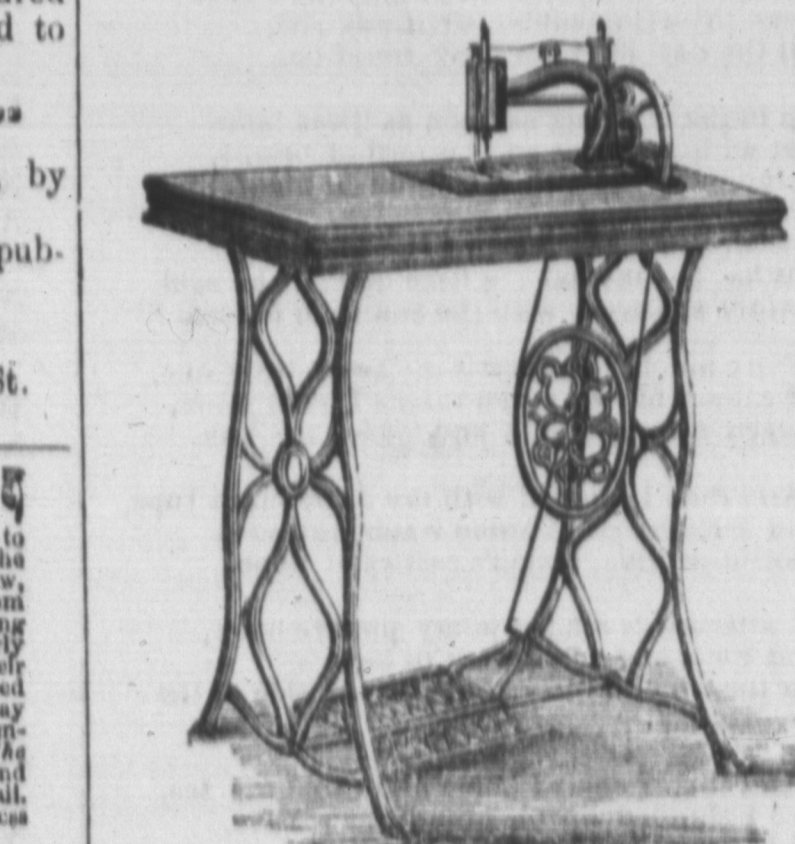
