THINGS NOT TO DO.

Don't keep your cattle in the yard on cold, stormy days, neither keep them housed in moderate weather. It is for the health of all animals that they have the sun, air, and exercise. Don't destory their life or health by treating them too delicate-

Don't leave a pot of paint where your cattle can lick it, nor let them run where there is anything newly painted. There is death in the pot, and death in fresh paint anywhere, as a short time since a neighbor of ours had reason to know, by the loss of two calves from this very cause.

Don' let the moss gather on the roofs of your buildings. It may be ornamental to some eyes, but not very beneficial to shingles. They will rot out fast enough by the moisture it retains; so sprinkle some fine lime upon it just before a rain, and you will be surprised to see how clean it will be taken off.

Don't be always complaining of the hard life a farmer has to lead. It is a habit some men cultivate, just to make themselves out poor, and keep down their rates. But they are never more deceived than when by so doing they think they are deceiving others.

Don't let your horse stand in the cold or a storm after driving, without a blanket. If you would know his feelings, or the consequences to him when this precaution is neglected, just expose yourself to a similar experience, and try it. - Congregation-

BUTTER MAKING.

A SINGULAR method of making butter has lately come into quite extensive use in France, based upon the observed fact that cream is changed into butter by being simply buried in the earth. The theory of this result is not very intelligible, though the fact is stated to be beyond question; and in Normandy and other parts of France, butter is actually prepared on a large scale in this way. The process consists in placing the cream in a linen bag of moderate thickness, which is carefully closed; then burying the bag about a foot and a half deep in the earth, and allowing it to remain from twenty-four to twenty-five hours. After the expiration of this period, the cream is found to have become hard, and it is then broken up, by means of a wooden beater, into small pieces, and enough water poured upon it to wash out the buttermilk. To prevent any mixture of earth, it is advisable to enclose the bag in a second one of larger size and coarser quality. This method of making butter saves a great deal of labor, and separates the butter more perfectly than the ordinary process; and we are assured that butter thus prepared is of most excellent quality.

A MATERNAL " ROOSTER."

An American paper relates an instance of a "rooster" bringing up a brood of chickens during the past summer. When the little chickens were only two or three days old, the old hen was killed by the hogs, and Mr. Rooster became their protector. He never deserted them till weaning time. He would put on all the agony of a mother, follow the little chickens, and "cluck" just as naturally as any hen. He always gathered them under his wings at night, and laboured most zealously in his new vocation.
