The N. Y. Mail says in reference to the recent California State Fair, there is nothing in all the land which can compare with a Pacific slope agricultural and horticultural fair, unless it be a fruit exhibition at Salt Lake.

FEEDING BEEF CATTLE.

Many reflecting farmers have come to the conclusion that it is far more profitable to retain their cattle at home, and feed them upon the farm products as far as it is practicable, and by so doing return to the farm in the shape of manure those elements of fertility which are of a necessity lessened with each succeeding crop.

If the various products of the farm in connection with grain be economically fed to beef cattle, and we take into consideration the manure as a portion of the profits, we shall find that in almost every case favorable results will ensue.

CARROTS AND ONIONS.—Cut into thin slices some carrots and one-third the bulk of onions, and fry them in the pan with a good lump of butter or dripping, taking care that they do not adhere to the bottom.

SALT IN COOKING VEGETABLES.—If one portion of a dish of vegetables be boiled in pure water, and the other in water to which a little salt has been added, a decided difference may be observed in the tenderness, and flavor.

RATS AND HARNES.—It is claimed that rats may be prevented from gnawing harness by mixing with the oil applied a little cayenne pepper, say a teaspoonful to the quart.

Calves two or three months old may be turned to grass, getting a few quarts of skimmed milk daily at noon, which will be all the better for them if thickened with a little Indian meal.

THE TIDES.—The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at Parrsboro', Cornwallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, and Truro.

High water at Pictou and Cape Tormentine 2 hours and 30 minutes later than at Halifax. At Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland Maine, 3 hours and 44 minutes later, and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 1 hour earlier, than at Halifax.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of the sun's setting from 12 hours, and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.
