THE EXHIBITION AT WOLFVILLE.

The Exhibition building was 100 feet long and 50 wide.

Apples and pears occupied three sides in rows of one dozen cach. A most beautiful sight.

Running down the centre was a double row of stands, with Squashes, Pumpkins, Cabbages, and Turnipe. Across near the end, was a table containing Grapes, Quinces, Plums, Peaches, &c. Dr. Hamilton, of Corn wallis, exhibited some magnificent black Hamburg Grapes grown in the open air.

THE TIDES .- The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at Parrsboro', Cornwallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, and Truro.

High water at Pictou and Cape Tormentine 2 hours and 30 minutes later than at Halifax. At Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland Maine, 3 hours and 44 minutes later, and 4t St. John's, Newfoundland, 1 hour earlier, than at Halifax.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.-Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.


FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT-Subtract the time of the sun's setting from 12 hours, and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.




