



The foregoing Section of the Act passed at the last Session of the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada-Chapter XX. intituled :--

" An Act to make temporary provision for the "election of memoers to serve in the House of Commons of Canada" is published for the information and guidance of Revisors appointed under the Nova Scotia Election Law of 1863:-

4. All persons nominated as Revisors, under Chapter twenty-eight of the Acts of the Legislature of Nova Scotia, passed in the year 1863, intituled "An act to regulate the election of members to serve in the General Assembly," shall in the present year 1871, within three months after the passing of this # ct, and in any future year all the time of their preparing the annual list of Electors qualifed to vote at election of members of the General Assembly, prepare also, and file with the Clerk of the Peace a like alphabetical list of Electors qualified to vote at elections of Members to serve in
