The foregoing Section of the Act passed at the last Session of the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada—Chapter XX, Intituled "An Act to make temporary provision for the election of members to serve in the House of Commons of Canada" is published for the information and guidance of revisors appointed under the Nova Scotia Election Law of 1863.

All persons nominated as Revisors, under Chapter twenty-eight of the Acts of the Legislature of Nova Scotia, passed in the year 1863, intended "An act to regulate the election of members to serve in the General Assembly," had in the present year 1871, within three months after the passing of this Act, and in any future year all the names of those qualified to vote at elections of members of the General Assembly, prepared a so, and filed with the Clerk of the Peace a list alphabetical list of Electors qualified to vote at elections of Members to serve in the House of Commons of Canada, by adding to the list of Voters for Members of the General Assembly the names of officials and employees of the Dominion Government qualified to vote at elections of Members of the General Assembly under the laws in force in Nova Scotia on the first day of July, 1867, but who may have been disqualified by any Act of the Legislature of that Province passed after the same day.
