

THE Act to establish one uniform Curr ncy for the Dominion of Canada, passed in the last Session of Parliament, provides :

"Thaton and afterJuly 1st, 1871, the value of the Dollar shall be such that Four Dollars and Eighty-six cents and two-thirds of a cent are equ 1 to One Pound Sterling.

4. No Post Caru can he used a see nd time. It a Post Card be posted which infringes any of the above conditions it will be forwarded by first post under cover to the Post Muster General.

A Post Card may be registered under the same Regulations as a letter, if the Registration charge be prepared by fixing an ordinary two cent Postage Stamp
