His Excellency the Governor General in Council.

On the recommendation of the Hon. the Minister of Customs, and for the reason given in his Report on the 8th June instant, His Excellency has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Red River, in the Province of Manitoba, from the point of its intersection with the Boundary Line between the United States and the said Province of Manitoba (Canada) to its junction with Lake Winnipeg shall be and the same is hereby declared to be a port of call for the purposes of the Port of Winnipeg under the following conditions and restrictions, that is to say:—

CHANGE OF CURRENCY. THE Act to establish one uniform Currency for the Dominion of Canada, passed in the last Session of Parliament, provides: That on and after July 1st, 1871, the value of the Dollar shall be such that four Dollars and Eighty-six cents and two-thirds of a cent are equal to One Pound Sterling.
